 S. J. J. Davitt's Master in aid for the County  
 of Greene. Whereas James B  
 Haywood ever about the 15th day of July in the  
 year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & thirty, which  
 then the complaint in the Court of Common Pleas  
 of the County of Greene against James B  
 Haywood and Nancy Burgess demanding  
 Judgment in relation to the Real Estate here-  
 inafter mentioned & described & the cause being  
 at issue. Came out to be heard on the 12th day of  
 November 1830. and much proceedings were had  
 therein as recited in a Judgment for foreclosure  
 of the said debt whereby it was adjudged and  
 decreed that the said Real Estate hereinafter men-  
 tioned and described be sold by S. J. Davitt  
 Master in aid for the County of Greene and the  
 same be sold for the purposes mentioned in the said  
 Judgment for foreclosure as by reference there-  
 to and also to said point will appear and the said  
 Master after having duly advertised the said  
 Real Estate for sale by public outcry on the third  
 day of January in the year of our Lord one  
 thousand eight hundred & thirty one and then openly  
 & publicly sold according to the custom of an-  
 cient and now disposed of the said lands for  
 B. Haywood for the sum of thirty five Dollars  
 being at that price the highest bid in the  
 now therefore known and seen by these presents  
 that S. J. Davitt's Master in aid for the  
 County of Greene in consideration  
 of the sum of thirty five Dollars to me paid  
 by the said James B. Haywood the receipt wher-  
 of is hereby acknowledged have granted  
 bargained, sold and released and by these  
 presents do grant bargain and release  
 unto the said James B. Haywood all that  
 piece parcel or tract of land situated lying  
 being in the County of Greene in the  
 as a part of the Haywood & Burgess tract

of land being the same conveyed to said Davis by the  
 Plaintiff on the 10th of March 1876 were supposed to contain  
 thirty acres more or less Beginning at Mullins line  
 Hardins line and from thence to an English Poplar and  
 thence the old wagon road leading to persons, then west  
 and includes all the land adjoining Mrs. Poper and Joseph  
 Hardin and to being a part of the Haywood tract as it  
 East end included within these lines together with all  
 and comprises the Right Members Plantations and  
 appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any  
 wise incident or appertaining and all the other right  
 title claim and interest whatsoever of the parties to the  
 cause of said and of each of them is and to the same  
 and of all other persons rightfully claiming from  
 under or by these or any of them to have and to hold  
 all and singular the premises before mentioned unto  
 the said James B. Haywood his heirs & assigns forever  
 In witness whereof I the said Master in aid for the  
 County of Greene have hereunto set my hand & seal this  
 seventh day of February in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand eight hundred & thirty one and in the
