Know all men by these  
presentes, that Elias Nesbitt  
of Greenville County in

the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of thirty  
one  $\frac{1}{4}$  thousand dollars to one paid by Moses Daues of  
Greenville County in the state aforesaid, have granted  
bargained sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release, unto the said  
Moses Daues, all that lot or piece of land on the  
North side of the Augusta Road near the corporate  
limits of the City of Greenville Beginning on said road  
thence along road to stake & said Elias Nesbitt  
corner thence with said line about 165 ft  
to a stake & thence across to Earles line about  
57 ft thence along Earles line to the beginning  
corner containing one fourth of an acre more  
or less and more particular known by a  
survey made by H. P. Johnson City surveyor.  
Together with all and singular the rights, members,  
hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said prem-  
ises belonging, or in any wise incident or apper-  
taining. To have and to hold, all and sing-  
ular the said premises before mentioned unto  
the said Moses Daues his heirs and assigns  
forever, and I do hereby bind myself, my heirs  
executors, and administrators, to warrant and  
forever defend all and singular the said  
premises unto the said Moses Daues his heirs  
and assigns, against me and my heirs, and every  
other person or persons lawfully claiming, or to  
claim the same, or any part thereof.
