sold released, and by these presents do grant
to you, all and release, unto the said Joseph
W. Sullivan, his heirs and executors or certain
years, or tract of Land, situated lying and
being in the County of Greenville and State af-
said, adjoining lands of Newell Sullivan, John
R. Arnold and others, beginning at a tree
at 37 m. on Moore's Cruso, thence N 48 E 0130.80 to
a tree 34 m. from, thence S 62 E 35, go to a post
37 m. and stee 37 m., thence S 75 E 10.90 to a
stone 37 m. in road, thence N 18 1/2 E 93.00 to
a stone 37 m. on said Cruso, thence with said
Cruso to the beginning corner containing One
hundred and eleven acres more or less.
Together with all and singular the Rights,
members, franchises and appurtenances
to the said premises belonging, or in
anywise in respect or depending;
To hold all and singular the
said premises before mentioned unto the
said Joseph W. Sullivan his heirs and
assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself
my heirs Executors and Administrators
to warrant and defend all and any
of the said premises unto the said Joseph
W. Sullivan his heirs and assigns, against
me and my heirs, and all others lawfully
claiming the same, or any part thereof.

One hundred and eighteen years of the sover-
eignty and independence of the United
States of America.
