gained, sold and transferred, and by these pres-  
ents do hereby grant, bargain sell and transfer  
and assayed to the said party of the second part  
an undivided one half interest in "Litter's" Plant-  
ers, to the said Mr. R. Berry on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of

December 1881, for an alleged just and useful  
compensation for a Cotton Planter to be used in  
Distribution together with a Company interest in the  
proceeds of sales said Cotton Planter, And the said  
party of the said party of the second part in con-  
sideration of the promises, agrees to under his per-  
sons, go selling said Cotton Planter and get him  
a State right to said Cotton Planter, and to use  
the same in a general way, and to make the same

travelling expenses while engaged in same, and  
for said planter, either expenses while engaged in  
pursuaining for said planter, other expenses to be paid
