

Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. A. Belue of the County of Spartanburg in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred & Sixty-eight Dollars, to me paid by R. L. Bowden of the County of Spartanburg in the State aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said R. L. Bowden, all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in Greenville County on both sides of Mill Creek, a waters of South Pacolet River having such metes & bounds as are shown by the following courses & lines, viz. Begin at a Post Oak (down) & run thence N. 84° W. 63.75 chs to a Spanish Oak; thence N. 12° W. 51.68 to a Post Oak, thence N. 89° W. 9.70 to a sweet Gum, thence N. 22° W. 13.85 to a Black Oak, thence N. 17° W. 26.50 to a Red Oak stump on side of road, thence S. 55° W. 26.10 chs along Thomas H. Belue's line to a stone, thence S. 52° E. 0.52 links to a Black Oak stump, thence S. 24° E. 4.70 chs, to a Black Oak, thence S. 62° E. 16.15 chs to a Red Oak, thence S. 37° E. 6.60 chs, to a Post Oak, thence S. 49° W. 11.93 chs to the beginning corner, containing One Hundred & Twenty-eight Acres, more or less, & bound by the lands of P. M. Thomas, T. M. Belue, Elsey Belue & others. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining, to me and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said R. L. Bowden his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my Heirs, Executors, and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said R. L. Bowden his heirs and assigns, against me and my Heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
