Holland and the said Elizabeth Robertson to take the tract, she now lies on that portion of the home tract, known in the said divide as tract No 3, taken off the lower end of the home tract containing One hundred and thirty acres more or less and hath such bounds & marks &c as represented by a plan hereto annexed. And on which the said John W. T. now resides. Now they indubitably witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and fifty dollars to us the said Elizabeth Robertson, Robert T. Holland and Benjamin Holland paid and accounted for in the settlement aforesaid do hereby relinquish to, and fully invest in the said John W. T. Holland and his heirs and assigns forever all and each of our rights, titles, interests claims or demands of in or to the said tract of land, and do hereby warrant and forever defend unto the said John W. T. Holland his heirs and assigns against the claims of all and each of us and our heirs forever. Containing twenty five acres more or less situated in the state and county aforesaid, with all and singular the Rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, to have and to hold all and sing upon the Rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances Belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining unto the said Perry Moore his heirs and assigns forever, I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend against myself my heirs and all persons from lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof.
