Cox, and Thomas Govet the Defendants, and to one James Birnie, also now deceased, an undivided four (4-5) fifths interest in to certain Real Estate in and around the city of Greenville in the County and State aforesaid, and more particularly described in the deed of conveyance of that date; and on the 30th day of September A. D. 1873, and said John Westfield, agreed to sell to the firm of Cox, Birnie & Co., (which was composed of himself and other parties last above-named,) certain other lots, pieces or parcels of land in and near the said city of Greenville, and County and State aforesaid, and were particularly described in said agreement; and that the said parties who were interested in the land above mentioned in order to facilitate the sale and transfer of said lands had agreed to and amongst themselves, to convey all of said lands in trust, to two of their numbers to sell and divide the proceeds of sale amongst the parties according to their respective interests; and prayed among other things that these matters might be arranged into, and if found advisable to carry out the said agreement in reference to a Trust Deed that a suitable Trust Deed be reported together with some suitable person or persons to act as Trustees; and, where as, upon the said cause being heard on the 17th day of June A. D. 1874, it was referred to a Special Referee to report on the various matters embraced in the pleadings in said cause and upon the report of said Special Referee, coming in containing the various recommendations therein more fully, forth it was on the 7th day of August A. D. 1874 among other things, ordered that Whitel Simmes and Thomas C. Govet be appointed Trustees, to whom William A. M. Daniel, Clerk of the said Court, should convey the said lands to have and to hold the same, to, for and upon the purposes, uses and trusts, as set forth and declared in the deo reported by said referee, and that the said William A. M. Daniel, Clerk as aforesaid did convey the lands mentioned in the pleadings to the said Trustees. Now therefore I know all men by these presents, That we Thomas C. Govet and Whitel Simmes Trustees, as aforesaid, by virtue of the powers conferred upon us in, and by the orders and Trust Deed aforesaid, do

in performance of our duty as such Trustees and also in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to us paid by Sarah A. Purvis before the delivery of these presents, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sarah A. Purvis, full that you have parcel and lot of land being parcels of the land above mentioned situate and lying in the city and county of Greenville and State aforesaid, commencing at a Stake West Street corner of John Purvis lot running thence A 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ W thru chains and five links to stake on twenty feet alley thereabout 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ W seven chains and seven links to stake on Johns Street thence S 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ E four chains and ninety three links to stake corner of Purvis lot thence A 39 $\frac{1}{2}$ E six chains and forty nine links to the beginning corner more fully represented by Seal of same made this day by H. P. Johnson Surveyor Containing two acres and four-tenths of one acre more or less together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or pertaining To Have And To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Sarah A. Purvis her Heirs and assigns forever freed from and discharged of all further Trusts whatever and we do hereby bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Sarah A. Purvis her Heirs and Assigns against us and our Heirs and every other person, whosoever lawfully claiming as to claim the same or any part thereof, by, through and under us as Trustees aforesaid Witness our hands and seals this first day of August in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and Sixty-Six and in the — year of the Independence of the United States of America.
