Cauble for the specified purpose all of an agreement to sell a certain piece or lot of land in said complaint described or to secure the possession thereof or in case this could not be done for the payment to Plaintiff the value thereof and whereas upon the final hearing of the said cause the Circuit Judge made his decree that the defendants A. E. Bowen & Jane E. Cauble as Executors & Executrix of Henry A. Cauble deceased pay to the Plaintiff Mrs. M. Humphreys the sum of two hundred dollars & the costs of said action and that upon payment of said sum and interest & the costs of said action that then said Plaintiff execute to the said Robert E. Bowen & Jane E. Cauble as Trustees under the will of the said Henry A. Cauble deceased all that lot and parcel of land situate lying and being in the city of Greenville in the County & State aforesaid on Fall & River streets bounded by lands of the said Harriet M. Humphreys & others containing one eighth of one acre more or less

Cauble in possession of during his life time Together with all and singular the rights members and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining To have <sup>and</sup> to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said Robert E. Bowen and Jane E. Cauble as Trustees under the will of the said Henry A. Cauble deceased and to their successors forever and I do hereby bind myself & my heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Robert E. Bowen & Jane E.
