McElhanahan late of the county of Greenville and state aforesaid made and delivered a deed of conveyance of a certain tract of land in Greenville County and State aforesaid to one James M. McElhanahan to hold for the use of his Amritte G. Feaster his daughter

during the term of his natural life and after death in trust for the children of said Amritte G. Feaster living at the time of her death and to be conveyed to them after the death of said Amritte G. Feaster and whereas after that time the said tract of land was sold under the order of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County and the funds arising therefrom reinvested in the tract of land herein after described and whereas after that time the said James M. McElhanahan was relieved as such trustee and Amritte G. Feaster appointed as trustee and Amritte G. Feaster appointed as trustee and his place and stead and whereas the said Amritte G. Feaster thereafter died leaving her surviving as her only living children Daniel, M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis and I now appoint as trustee in her place and stead with orders to convey the said lands herein after described to said Daniel, M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis the only children of the said Amritte G. Feaster living at the time of her death and therefore in order to carry out the provisions of the said trust and in accordance to the decree of the Court made in the case of *Cassett, M. Davis vs. Daniel M. Feaster* in the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County South Carolina on the day of April a. d. 1890 filed 19th April 1890. Be it now all men by these presents that I David P. Verner Trustee as aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of Five Dollars to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Daniel M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis (nee Feaster) the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said Daniel M. Feaster and Harriet M. Davis, all that piece, parcel and tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville and state of South Carolina known as the J. G. McElhanahan home place less Forty one and one half acres deeded to Elizabeth Johnson on the 19th day of April 1877. the said tract of land bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a stake in the road leading from Greenville to Chick Bridge thence N 34 E 14.40 to a stake in a branch thence S 60 E 8.50 to a heap of rocks S 30 W 14 to a corner near said road thence with said road to a corner in fork of road thence with small road to a stake in said road S 71 E 20.50 thence S 53 W 13 to a stake thence N 60 W 53.80 to a stake thence N 53 E 13 to a Spanish oak thence N 50 E 16 to a maple thence N 20 E 4.75 to a Black Gum thence N 60 E 1.00 to a stake in front of said road thence with the meanders of said road to the beginning containing one hundred and Ninety two and one half acres or less and adjoining lands of Elizabeth R. McElhanahan a day and other the interest comprised by me by the said boundaries
