Latimer praying among other things that they be allowed to choose a certain tract of land in said complaint described for the tract hereinafter mentioned and whereas such proceedings were had in the said cause that on the 30th day of March 1888 an order was made therein allowing the said exchange and directing the said J. P. Latimer to convey by his/her deed the tract hereinbefore described to the said Edmund Smith and wife and their children upon the same terms as are contained in the deed from Benjamin Grayham to said Mary E. Smith dated 10th December 1872 except the interest reserved therein to said Grayham and wife they being now dead which said deed is now in the office of the Register of Deeds conveyances for said County in Book E. & page 473. Now therefore know all men by these presents that I Joseph P. Latimer in consideration of the premises and of the conveyance to me of the said Grayham tract of land described in said complaint by D. O. Herne Esquire Master for said County in compliance with the judgment of the court in said cause and for the purpose of complying with said judgment on my part have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Edmund Smith and Mary E. Smith all that tract of land situate lying and being in the County and

of or laid on Saluda River containing Ninety seven acres more or less bounded by lands of Franklin Chastain & H. Holiday and others and known as the "old Jacob Cooley place" or "E. M. Holliday tract" together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining upon the following lines contained in said Grayham Deed that is to say to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said Mary E. Smith during her natural life and at her death said tract of land to revert to the heirs of the body of the said Mary E. Smith nevertheless it is understood that Edmund Smith husband of the said Mary E. Smith is to have a life interest in said tract of land and at the death of the survivor of said Mary E. Smith and Edmund the title to said tract of land to vest absolutely in the heirs of the body of said Mary E. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Edmund and Mary E. and their survivors and the heirs of the body of the said Mary E. Smith their heirs and assigns forever against all persons whomsoever claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
