Now, therefore, know all men by these presents, that I, Annie Roman, by and through attorney in fact the Greenville Savings Bank, in consideration of the premises and of the sum of Two Hundred dollars to me in hand paid as and before the sealing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto James Fields, of all that certain lot or parcel of land situate in State and County aforesaid, in the City of Greenville, on the north side of Court Street, East of Main. Beginning at the corner of Jas. W. Fields lot, thence in a northerly direction along the line of said Field one hundred and twenty feet to the land sold by Mrs. Sullie D. Cade to J. M. Hunter, thence in a westerly direction along said land sixty feet, thence in a southerly direction with Mrs. Doga's line one hundred and twenty feet to Court Street, thence with Court Street to the beginning.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident, or appertaining. To have and to hold, all and singular, the said premises unto the said James Fields, his heirs and assigns forever. And I, the said Annie Roman, by and through my said attorney in fact, do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend the said premises unto the said James Fields, his heirs and assigns forever from and against me, the said Annie
