All that piece, parcel and tract of land lying, being and situate in the State and County aforesaid, containing twenty acres, more or less, and bounded by lands of James Gossell, P. D. Gilreath, South Pacolet and others; being more fully described in a deed to the said W. C. Bridgeman. Also all that other piece, parcel and tract of land lying, being and situate in the same State and County aforesaid, which I purchased from J. Berry Gossell. Containing twenty-five acres, more or less, and bounded by lands of P. D. Gilreath, James Gossell, South Pacolet River and is in Glassy Mountain Township.

Together with all and singular the rights, privileges and appendages and appurtenances to the said property belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said G. M. Bridgeman, his heirs and assigns forever. And do hereby bind myself and my heirs, executors and administrators to maraud and pursue defend all and singular the said premises unto the said G. M.
