

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That

I, Jacob Belcher in the State aforesaid for and of Three hundred Dollars to Mrs. in consideration of the sum and before the sealing of these presents by William Harrison (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said William Harrison

All that certain tract or parcel of land, situated lying and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid. This being the same land that William Harrison deeded to Jacob Belcher, in the year 1896, known as a part of George Dill's land. Bounded by lands of Jonathan Reese, J. R. Moon and others, containing forty and one half acres (46 1/2) more or less.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in any-wise incident or appertaining. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said William Harrison and his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William Harrison Heirs and Assigns, against Heirs, and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
