Whereas, under the Act of the Legislature of the State of South Carolina, approved December 24th, 1870, the Trustees of the Wadsworthville Poor School and their successors in office are authorized and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple, to any person who shall purchase all or any portion of the lands left by the last will and testament of Thomas Wadsworth, deceased, for the support of a poor school in Laurens County, if in their judgment it will be best for the interests of said school,

And whereas, it has been determined by said Trustees that it will be best for the interest of said school that the lands herein after described be sold, and the said lands being a portion of the lands left by the last will and testament of Thomas Wadsworth deceased for the support of a poor school in Laurens County,

Now therefore, know all men by these Presents that we, W. Wright, M. M. Yeagre, W. P. Turner, R. J. Copeland and R. C. Davis, Trustees of the Wadsworthville Poor School of Laurens County, in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and forty (440) Dollars to us in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these Presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted bargained sold and released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release unto John T. Gilreath his heirs and assigns forever, all that piece parcel or lot of land situate lying and being in Greenville County on Childress Beaserdam creek, waters of Enoree River, containing Eighty eight (88) Acres more or less, being near the North side of the large tract originally Six hundred and Seventy Acres and bounded by lands of Geo. Fowler and James Bull and others being a portion of the said lands to expire the 12th October 1900 by the trustees of Wadsworthville Poor School five dollars per acre being the sum of One thousand eight hundred and forty dollars.

Thence S 89 $\frac{1}{2}$  E W 24.00 to a stone, thence N 24 34' W 13.60 to a stone, thence S 76 41' W 13.03 to a stone, thence S 13 48' E 14.97 to a P. O. thence S 84 11' W 13.50 to a stone, thence S 85 14' E 11.70 to a P. O. thence N 69 14' E 8.05 to a persimmon on branch, thence down branch to Childress Beaserdam creek, thence down the same to the beginning

Carver bounded by Belliss, Jones, Fowler, Bull and others,

Together with all and singular the Rights, members, Dwellments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or pertaining

To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said John T. Gilreath his heirs and assigns forever,

And we do hereby bind ourselves and our successors and assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John T. Gilreath his heirs and assigns against us and our successors and assigns and the heirs and assigns of Thomas Wadsworth deceased lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof.
