To have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said John N Gangford his heirs and assigns forever, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John N Gangford his heirs and assigns against ourselves and our heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
