

And I, the undersigned, on the eighteenth day of September, 1900, the said  
above-named petitioner, now, by my Board of  
Corporation,

And I, the said Board of Corporation, on the  
second day of November, did file with the Secretary of State  
their return, in writing, over their signatures, certifying among  
other things, that pursuant to published notice so required in the  
commissions of the said corporation, the books of subscriptions to the  
capital stock of the aforesaid company, were duly opened, and that  
thereupon meeting fifty per centum of the capital stock was  
subscribed by one thousand stockholders; that thereupon a meeting  
of stockholders was called, and the aforesaid company delinquent,  
by the election of a Board of Directors, and other necessary officers.  
That furthermore they have complied with all the requirements of an  
Act of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina  
entitled, "An Act to Provide for the Formation of Certain Cor-  
porations and to Define the Powers Thereof," affixed the ninth  
day of March, A.D., 1876, and acts amendatory thereto.

Now, therefore, I, M. R. Cooper, Secretary of State, by virtue  
of the authority invested by the aforesaid Act, and acts amending  
the same, do hereby certify that the said company has been fully  
organized, according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name  
and for the purpose indicated in their written declarations, and  
that they are duly authorized to commence business under their  
charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed  
and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds, County Clerk  
in each County where such corporation shall have a business  
office.
