I know all men by these presents that I, M.P. Roberts, of the County of Greenville, in the State of South Carolina, in consideration of and in payment to me, paid by the Greenville and Santee Railroad Company, have granted, bargained, sold, released and conveyed, and by these presents do hereby grant, bargain, sell, release and convey unto the said "The Greenville and Santee Railroad Company," and its Successors and assigns forever, for railroad purposes, the right of way through my tract of land, situate in said County and State adjoining lands of Mr. B. Hyde, J. B. Breditt and others, said right of way to extend one hundred feet, measuring from the center of the track of said railroad, in opposite directions, and at right angles with the same, to show and to have said right of way to the said Railroad Company, and its Successors, and assigns forever, in fee simple for railroad purposes.

Whereas J. O. Allen, C. B. Holloway, C. B. Davis, and C. S. Logan, all of whom reside in the City and County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, did on the sixteenth day of April, 1901, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth: First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above named. Second: The name of the proposed corporation to be that of The Workingman's Savings and Loan Co.

The principal place of business of the corporation to be Greenville, S.C. The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do, to have the power to make loans of money secured by mortgages of real estate, bonds or stocks or such other security as may be deemed advisable, to receive deposits and savings, to build and rent houses, or otherwise to improve the real estate held and owned by the company, to buy and sell real estate, bonds and mortgages, bonds and stocks and other evidence of debt, and also to perform the duties of an act as administrator, executor and trustee. Third: The amount of the capital stock to be twenty thousand dollars, payable in ten installments of one dollar each on each share; the number of shares into which the same is to be divided, to be two thousand, of the par value of ten dollars each. Now therefore, I, M. R. Cooper, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by an Act of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, entitled, "An Act to Provide for the Formation of certain corporations and to define the Powers thereof," approved the ninth day of March A.D. 1876, and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby commission the above named petitioners a Board of Corporation, and do hereby authorize and empower them to open books of Subscriptions to the Capital Stock of the company proposed to be organized, as set forth in the above mentioned Declaration. And I do hereby require that the said Board of Corporation shall give not less than one days previous notice by advertisement in the Greenville Daily News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, of the time and place when and where said books of
