Dollars, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Sterling Industrial College, a corporation organized under the laws of South Carolina, in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sterling Industrial College, all that piece, parcel or lot of land just beyond the incorporate limits of the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing one acre, more or less, situate on the south side of Jenkins street, and having the following boundaries: Beginning at an iron pin on the north side of Jenkins street (which does not extend entirely through said lot), and running thence S.14 1/2 E.3.58 chains to an iron pin; thence N.76 1/4 W.2.80 chains to an iron pin; thence N.14 1/2 E.3.57 chains to an iron pin; thence S.77 E.2.80 chains to the beginning corner, being the same lot of land conveyed to me by Mary Williams February 10th. 1896, deed recorded in office of Register of Mesne Conveyance in Book C.C.C. page 152.
