Thomas F. Strand, alias Clegg, City, County and State,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Thomas F. Strand, all that certain lot, piece or tract of land situated, lying and being in the State of South Carolina and County of Greenville, just outside the incorporated limits of the City of Greenville, having bounds as follows, to wit, beginning at a stone on the north side of Montgomery Avenue, corner of Montg. Ave. and Broad Street, running thence N. 32° 15' W. with right and running line one hundred and fifty (150) feet to a stone there S. 56° 45' W. and so running line one hundred and fifty (150) feet to a stone on the Montgomery Avenue; front 100' 15" E. width east twelve sixty (60) feet to the beginning corner, being the same lot of land named, to me, Wm. C. King, by our Notary Public, by due bearing date 20th of May, 1903, and record in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Greenville County, in said State on June 8, 1903, in Court of Probate of Greenville County, before the Honorable J. H. Gandy, Justice of the Peace, of the west estate of W. C. King deceased, both in the condition of his estate of said deceased in the opinion of the Probate Court for said State and County, by whom it is certified that it is in a summing up, inasmuch as such decree by the said Register Sheriff of said County and Clerk, to the Sheriff of Greenville, now Mrs. Pauline M. Clegg, by deed bearing date January 5, 1876, and record in said Office on October 21, 1876, in Dower Book "H.C.", at page 532, b.

And do hereby bind myself and my Heirs, Executors, and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said Thomas F. Strand, and his  
Heirs and Assigns, against myself and my Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
