KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That *A. John T. Bramlett*, of the City of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Nine hundred twenty-five Dollars, to *me* in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by *Robert D. Rowland*, of the City of Greenville in the State aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said *Robert D. Rowland* all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, on branch water of Reedy River near the Woodside Cotton Mill containing four acres more or less, and bounded as follows: Beginning at an iron pin for what is known as Monaghan Mill Street Land running thence $85\frac{1}{4}$ E. eight hundred and forty-three (843) feet to an iron pin, thence $85\frac{1}{4}$ W. two hundred fourteen feet to another iron pin. Thence with line of Woodside Cotton Mill Land, $85\frac{1}{4}$ W. eight hundred forty-three (843) feet to an iron pin on said street, thence with said street $85\frac{1}{4}$ E. two hundred fourteen ($84\frac{1}{4}$) feet to the beginning corner, according to a survey made by W. A. Hudson February 1st, 1903. This is a part of the tract conveyed to me by *John Marshall* December 19th, 1900. Deed recorded in R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Book XX, page 300.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said *Robert D. Rowland*, his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And *I* do hereby bind *myself*, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said *Robert D. Rowland*, his

Heirs and Assigns, against *me* and *my* Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
