TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said

W. R. McMillian his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said W. R. McMillian.

Heirs and Assigns, against me and my Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.


Renunciation of Dower.
