KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Kelatiel L. Black and Belle P. Hink, of the City of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty One hundred Dollars, to be paid in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Edith Johnson Wilson of the City of Greenville in the State, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Edith Johnson Wilson all that certain parcel or lot, of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville on the north-east corner of Mainly and Pettigree streets, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit: Beginning at an iron stake on the corner of Mainly and Pettigree streets, and running thence N. 18° W. with east side of Mainly street Seventy-five feet to a stake, thence N. 64° E. one hundred and five feet to another stake, thence S. 15° E. Seventy-five feet to a stake on Pettigree street, thence with Pettigree street S. 64° E. one hundred and five feet to the beginning corner, being the same lot of land described in J. F. Hink and D. H. Elbaugh to Kelatiel L. Black on the 2nd day of April 1902, a one-half interest was deeded to Belle P. Hink by Kelatiel L. Black on the 16th day of October 1902, copy, date respectively recorded in office of Register of Deeds, Greenville County in Book A. S. I. page 747 and Book A. L. I. page 372. The said lot is a part of lot No. 1 of Block No. 6 of Boyce lands as shown on a plan recorded in said Register's office in Book Q. J. page 934 but by a later subdivision is now known as lot No. 12, Block No. 6 set forth Book A. page 91.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Edith Johnson Wilson, her Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said Edith Johnson Wilson, her

Heirs and Assigns, against us and our Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
