KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS; That DUNEAN MILLS, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of South Carolina, party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to it in hand paid by Southern Railway Company, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Virginia, hereina or for convenience styled the Railway Company, party of the second part,

A RIGHT OF WAY over and upon the lands of the party of the first part, situate, lying and being at or near GREENVILLE, in the County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, for each of the industrial spur tracks hereinafter described, ten (10) feet in width on either side of the center line thereof; the said industrial tracks being described as follows, to-wit: TRACK No. 1: A spur track which will spring from the main track of the Railway Company running between Columbia and Greenville, at a point thereon 1091 feet south of Milepost No. 141, and will extend thence in a Northeasterly direction for a distance of 1650 feet, more or less; of which 645 feet will be upon the present right of way of the Railway Company for its said main track, and 1005 feet, more or less, upon the said land of the party of the first part; TRACK No. 2: A sour track which will spring from said track No. 1, at a point thereon 967 feet from said beginning point thereof, and will extend thence, in an easterly direction, and entirely upon the said land of the party of the first part, for a distance of 215 feet, more or Less; TRACK No. 3: A spur track which will spring from said track No. 1, at a point thereon 1048 feet from said beginning point thereof, and will extend thence in an easterly direction, and entirely upon said land of the party of the first part for a distance of 280 feet, more or less; TOJETHER with such additional right of way as may be necessary to accomodate cut slopes and fill slopes for each of said industrial tracks at one to one and one-half to one, respectively, and as may be necessary for the purpose of shifting and relocating said industrial tracks, or any of them, or constructing, maintaining and operating branches or extensions thereof, to serve with shipping facilities industries located upon said lands.
