


Vacant Land



State of South Carolina,  
pursuant to a warrant from  
John Thomas Esq<sup>r</sup>, Commissioner  
of Locations dated the 4<sup>th</sup> day  
of March 1784, I have admitted  
and laid out unto —  
Thomas Harow a tract of  
land in the district of New  
Six containing six hun-  
dred and forty acres, bound-  
ing on all sides by Vacant  
Land, and hath such shape  
form and Marks as the  
above plat represents.  
Surveyed the 29<sup>th</sup> of May  
1784,

Delivered this plat to Thomas Harow



Sure the first day of October 1784, Wm. Vivian, representative  
of the aforesaid plats made oath before me  
that he sent this plat and worked towards that  
town in order to have them passed through  
different offices, before the land office was shut  
but that the messenger by some accident failed to  
together with the abolition of the British gove-  
rnment, is the reason they were not carried to  
the offices, sworn to before me John Thomas  
of South Carolina,

Pursuant to a warrant issued to me  
under the hand & seal of John Breckinridge,  
Surveyor General dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of September  
1774, I have admitted and laid out unto Will-  
iam Hedges, a plantation or tract of land in Orange  
County containing One hundred and fifty acres  
are lying & being on Sugar Creek water of fair forest, bounded Northwestwardly by Henry  
Harden's land, North Eastwardly by Thomas Adams land, and on all other sides by vacant land  
and hath such shape, form & marks as the above plat represents. Certified under my hand
