



Vacant

South Carolina. Pursuant to a warrant from William Blasingame Esq<sup>r</sup>  
Commissioner of Locations in the District of Greenville dated the 3<sup>d</sup> of  
December 1840 I have admeasured and laid out unto William Cox a  
tract of six hundred and twenty acres of land situate in said District on both  
sides of a small creek called Bates Branch waters of the middle fork of Saluda river  
including one entire grant of seventy six acres formerly granted to John Moore together  
with a part of a grant of four hundred and seventy four acres originally  
surveyed for William W. Cook, which is now resurveyed for the purpose of  
obtaining a new grant the remainder consisting of land not theretofore  
granted the whole bounded by lines running N.W. and S.E. by A. Whitney's  
land N.E. by Samuel M. Justice and No. Cleveland's land all other  
sides by vacant land or land owners unknown having such  
form and marks buildings and boundaries as the above-plate  
expresses it.
