

Chestnut pernel now gine; thence S. 1 30' W. 614 feet to an old red oak corner; thence S. 9 50' E. With the eld Fisher line (1267.5) feet to an old iron stake in place of an old stump (new gode), an old marked corner thence S. 43 30' W. 534 feet to the Gowansville Road; thence with sold road N. 276 feet to a stake thence N. 11 15' W. 299 feet to a double black oak on east side of road thence Nor 210 feet to a stake in a dry hellow; thence N. 20 45' W. 1055 feet to a stake; thence N. 82.
