W. Poore's land tract deeded to Marion Cochran, thence N. 40.50 chains to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$, thence N. 35. W. 16 chains to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ on branch, thence N. 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. - 4.65 chains to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ in fork of branch, the branch the line, thence N. 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 21.50 to a stone 3 $\frac{1}{2}$.
