in the sum of Five Hundred and Fifty (\$550.00) Dollars, as evidenced by five notes payable in five semi-annual installments, the first four notes being in the sum of \$100.00 each, and the fifth note being for \$150.00, the said notes providing that in the event of default in the payment of interest or principal as the same becomes due that the entire indebtedness shall immediately become ~~due~~ and payable; it being hereby agreed that in event of such default this mortgage may be foreclosed and I (hereinafter agreed to pay all costs and attorney's fees) further agreed to pay all costs and attorney's fees in the event of a foreclosure.

In the presence of, witnessed and acknowledged by me, R. C. Durham, this day of July, 1888, at the office of the Clerk of Court, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, bounded on the north by land of John Fisher, on the east by Lot no. 1 of the William Durham Estate lands, on the south by lands of R. C. Durham and on the west by Lot no. 3 of the William Durham Estate lands; the land hereby conveyed being known as Lot no. 2 of the Estate lands of William Durham which was sold to F. P. Bacon by C. Triman, master of Greenville County, in the partition suit in which said lands were divided and sold, and said lands are described as follows:

Beginning at a stake in the R. C. Durham line the southwest corner of Tract no. 1 of said William Estate lands and runs thence North 56° West 16.30 poles to a stake southeast corner of Lot no. 3; thence with the line of same North 14 degrees East 29.70 poles to a stake in the John C. Fisher line; thence with said line South 82 degrees East 10 poles to a stake northwest corner of aforesaid Lot no. 1; thence with the line of same South 5½ degrees West 36.60 poles to the beginning, containing 40.25 acres, more or less.

Reference is hereby had to the deed of even date from F. P. Bacon to R. C. Durham and this mortgage is given to secure the unpaid portion of the purchase price.

Default in payment of principal or interest matures the entire indebtedness.
