SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, I, John M. Austin, the said, in and by a certain promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents, due well and truly indebted to Peoples Bank of Fountain Inn, in the full and just sum of Thirteen Thousand Dollars, to be paid December 1st, 1923.

with interest thereon from maturity at the rate of per cent. per annum to be computed and paid annually in advance, ^{mailed} until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal, and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ~~10~~ ³⁵ per cent. besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage) as in and by the said note, reference being thereto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Peoples Bank of Fountain Inn, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of three Dollars, to the said John M. Austin, in hand well and truly paid by the said Peoples Bank of Fountain Inn,

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Peoples Bank of Fountain Inn,

all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land lying in the town of Greenville, County and state aforesaid, bounded on the North by lands of Frank Austin estate, now owned by G. B. Dunn on the East by lands and Mrs. Cleveland, on the south by of G.W. Sullivan and on the west by lands of Mrs. Cleveland, President Major, containing 350 acres, more or less, being the same as to John M. Austin by his father F.M. Austin and being the same tract of land deeded to F.M. Austin by D.P. Verner Master in Greenville County by deed dated Oct. 7, 1889, recorded in R.M.C. office for County in Book 84 at page 50, this conveyance being of 250 acres more or less, the tract containing 250 acres, however, by a new survey all of which lands are fully set forth by metes and bounds, corners and distances, except a plat of same made by J.A. Surveyor, Aug. 23, 1916.

Also all that other piece, parcel and tract of land in the County and state aforesaid, in Oaklawn township, containing 25.97 acres more or less, bounded on the North by lands of Sam Berry and E.F. Drayton, on the east by lands of Katrine Mfg. Co. and on the west by lands of Katrine Mfg. Co. and W.A. Ross, all of which is fully set out upon a plat of said lands by C.M. Furman, Jr. on dated Jun. 24, 1923, and being a portion of the lands conveyed to J.M. Austin by Katrine Mfg. Co. by deed dated Feb. 9, 1917, recorded in said office in Book 52 at page 303.

Also all that other piece, parcel and tract of land in the County and state aforesaid, in Oaklawn township containing 1.97 acres more or less, bounded on the North by lands of P.C. Scott and W. Rogers, on the east by lands of B.F. Sherman, on the south by lands of Katrine Mfg. Co. and on the west by lands of Katrine Mfg. Co. and W.A. Ross, all of which is fully set out upon a plat of same by C.M. Furman, Jr. Engineer, dated Jun. 24, 1923, and being a portion of the lands conveyed to the said J.M. Austin by Katrine Mfg. Co. by deed dated Feb. 9, 1917, recorded in said
