SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, I, the said Mallie M. Shinn,
in and by my certain day of August, note..... in writing, of
even date with these presents, well and truly indebted to
W. E. McIntosh of Atlanta, Georgia
in the full and just sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000)
Dollars, to be paid monthly in installments of fifteen (\$1500) Dollars each
on the 1st day of each month hereafter, beginning Aug. 1, 1923,
until said sum of fifteen Thousand Dollars is paid in full
with interest thereon, from date _____ at the rate of 8 3/4 per cent. per annum to be
computed and paid monthly, ^{and for value received}
until paid in full all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note ^{shall} become immediately due, to the option of the holder hereof, who
may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of ^{one-half of one percent} (\$750.00) Dollars
^{plus} besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to
the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part
thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference
being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. E. McIntosh,

Carolina in the City of Greenville on the north side of
East Main Street and having a frontage on said street
of sixty (60) feet with a depth of two hundred (200)
feet; this being Lot No. twenty-four (24) of Section "F"

and recorded in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County
in Plat Book "A" pages 337-345, and being the same
lot of land conveyed to me this day by said W. E.
