SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, I am at present well and truly indebted to my son, David Rosenmond, the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) due to me by virtue of a promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents, made by me well and truly indebted to him.

in the full and just sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) Dollars, to be paid: One year after date.

with interest thereon from Date at the rate of Eight per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid annually.

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of One-half cent of the amount due thereon, besides all costs and expenses of collection,

to be added to the amount due on said note and to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That the said Mortgagor, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Mortgagee, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to the said Mortgagor, in hand well and truly paid by the said Mortgagee, at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain and release unto the said Mortgagee, and his heirs and assigns, forever, all and singular that certain piece, parcel, lot or tract of land situate, lying and being in the County, State aforesaid,

On the south side of the White Horse Road and the head waters of Golden Grove Creek and having the following metes and bounds to wit:

Beginning at a stone 3x6 in the White Horse Road, Post Oak 3x6 on the south side of the road and running thence S. 44 1/2 W. 29.90 to a stone 3x6, thence N. 60 1/2 W. 4.00 to a stone 3x6 Mrs. McWhitie's line, thence with said line 19.76 to a stone 3x6 on said road, thence with said road as a line 3.50 to the beginning corner. The same being Lot No. 7 of the division of tract containing 114 acres.

Also, Lot No. 2 of the same subdivision containing eight (8) acres, more or less, lying near the above described tract and adjoining Sam Rosenmond, Bud Ward, et al. Beginning at a stone 3x6 on White Horse Road and running thence S. 44 1/2 W. 18.30 to a stone 3x6 on McWhitie's line, thence S. 88 1/2 E. 6.88 to a stone 3x6m to Sam Rosenmond's corner, thence S. 44 1/2 E. 13.75 to stone 3x6 on said road, thence along said road 5.00 to the beginning corner.
