bargain, sell and release unto the said

estate, All that certain piece of land, being and situate in the town of Fountain
Inn, County and State aforesaid having the follow-
ing metes and bounds to wit: Commencing at
an iron pin on Allie guard house corner, running
thence with the guard house line 20 feet
to an iron pin; thence with guard house line 32 $\frac{1}{2}$
feet to an iron pin on Depot line, thence, thence
Depot line 62 feet to an iron pin, thence, thence
depot line 27 feet to an iron pin near the Rail-
road side track, thence, up the said railroad
55 feet to Mrs Nan Armstrong corner thence, along
Mrs Nan Armstrong's line 103 feet to an iron pin
on Allie, thence along said Allie 50 feet to be-
ginning corner, bounded by Mrs Nan Armstrong,
