## GRANTING CLAUSE VI

FURTHER PROPERTY CONVEYED TO TRUSTEE.

All property, of every character whatever, which from time to time after the date of this Indenture may be delivered, or may by writing of any kind be conveyed, mortgaged, pledged, assigned or transferred, to the Trustees by the Company or by any other Person to be held as part of the Trust Estate; and the Trustees are authorized to receive any such property as and for additional or substituted security hereunder.

## GRANTING CLAUSE VII

OTHER AND AFTER-ACQUIRED PROPERTY.

All other property, real, personal or mixed, of every nature and description and wheresoever situated, whether or not specifically described, and all interests therein (including leasehold estates), now owned or hereafter acquired or belonging to the Company or to which it now is, or may at any time hereafter be, in any manner entitled at law or in equity.

It is the intention and it is hereby agreed that all property, real, personal or mixed, and interests in such property, mortgaged hereby or intended so to be, hereafter acquired by the Company, and required to be subjected hereto or intended so to be by the provisions hereof, forthwith upon acquisition thereof by the Company, shall be as fully embraced within the lien hereof as if such property and interests in property were now owned by the Company, and were specifically described herein and conveyed hereby.

## GRANTING CLAUSE VIII

APPURTENANCES, INCOME, AWARDS, ETC.

All tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances belonging or in any way appertaining to the aforementioned premises, property, rights and franchises or any part thereof, with all the reversions and remainders, and, to the extent permitted by law and subject to the applicable provisions of this Indenture, all income, revenues, earnings, rents, tolls, issues, products and profits thereof, and all the estate, right, title, interest and claim whatsoever, at law and in equity, which the Company now has or may hereafter acquire in and to the aforementioned
