with interest thereon, from maturity at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum, to be
computed and paid annually, 1925,

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or
interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof,
who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney fee of

10% besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be
added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or
any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference
being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.)

bargain, sell and release unto the said Citizens Bank of Taylors,

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land
situate, lying and being in the state and
county aforesaid, in Oneal Township, and
having the following metes and bounds to wit:
Beginning at a stake in a road corner of
tract No. 3 the N.E. 1/4, Barbare residence and
running thence S. 29 1/8 E. 260 feet to a stake
in branch; thence down said branch 55
feet to a stone; thence S 5 1/2 E. 112 feet to a
large poplar; thence S. 82 E. 208.6 feet to a
stone; thence N. 67 1/2 E. 168.3 feet to a stake
on right bank of a creek; thence up said
Clear creek 182.5 feet to an iron pin in said
creek at the bridge; thence with said road
N. 2 1/2 W. 427.7 feet to a stone near the old gin
house; thence N. 89 W. 1234 feet to a stone in a field;
thence S. 24 E. 317 feet to the branch; thence down
said branch 220 feet to a stake at the mouth
of another branch; thence up said branch S. 32 1/2
W. 190 feet to a bend in said branch; thence
S. 13 W. 190 feet to a stake in branch; thence S.
65 E. 306 feet to a stake; thence S. 37 1/8 E. 122 feet to a
stake; thence S. 11 1/8 E. 447 feet to a stake in road;
thence with said road N. 62 E. 556 feet to the
beginning corner and being tract No. 1 of a plat
surveyed by H. S. Brockman, July 7th 1919 and
containing 43.02 acres, more or less; less 425 acres
conveyed to C. J. Collier by Sue S. Smith and
also 1 1/2 acres deeded by J. D. Atkins to D. S. Lynn,
also 2 acres more or less deed by J. D. Atkins
to T. B. Powell (see deeds recorded in R. M. C.
office Greenville, S.C) leaving 25 2/100 acres more or
less, bounded by lands D. S. Lynn, T. B. Powell and
C. J. Collier.
