SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, I, the said *I. W. R. Carson*, in and by my certain Promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents, am well and truly indebted to

John Henderson and Dr. T. Darrell in the full and just sum of Eighteen Hundred Thirty (\$1830.00) Dollars, to be paid January 6th 1922

with interest thereon, from January 6th 1922 at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum, to be computed and paid annually

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid; then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fees of 12% plus per cent. of the indebtedness as Attorney's fees, besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, to be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind, all of which is secured under this mortgage; as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.)

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that I, *I. W. R. Carson*, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, am for the better securing the payment thereof to the said

John Henderson and Dr. T. Darrell according to the terms of said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me, the said

*I. W. R. Carson* in hand well and truly paid by the said *John Henderson and Dr. T. Darrell*

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents, do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said *John Henderson and Dr. T. Darrell* their

heirs and assigns, all that piece, parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in York Township County and State aforesaid and on the Staunton Bridge road near Welcome Church. Beginning at an iron pin on the Staunton Bridge Road at the corner of lands of W. R. Carson, the tract now being conveyed in a deed of even date to John Henderson and Dr. T. Darrell and running thence N. 81-27 W. Fourteen Hundred Thirty-three feet and seven inches to an iron pin, thence S. 24-35 W One hundred feet to an iron pin, thence S. 35-04 E. Nine hundred and thirty-seven feet to an iron pin in the Staunton Bridge Road, thence with said road N. 64-38 E. Six hundred feet and seven inches to a stake, thence N. 47-09 E. two hundred and sixty-three feet to a stake, thence N. 42-01 E. two hundred seventy-eight and one-half feet to a stake and being the beginning corner, containing fifteen acres, more or less, and being tract conveyed to me by deed of W. E. McCain dated Feb. 2, 1920 and recorded in the R. R. C. Office for Greenville County Feb. 10th 1920 in vol. 55 at page 242.

Also all that other piece parcel or tract of lands adjoining the above tract on the west and containing six and two-tenths acres, more or less, beginning at a corner of R. D. Chapman land and running thence with his line N. 88-16 W. three hundred and eighty feet and four inches to an iron pipe, thence with said Chapman's line N. 70-20 W. One thousand and eleven feet to an iron pin, thence N. 87-17 E. One thousand and forty-nine feet and nine inches to an iron pin, thence S. 33 E. four hundred and eighty-nine feet and seven inches to the beginning corner.
