in the Office for the Recording of Deeds, in and for Northampton County, at Easton, Pennsylvania, in Deed Book G, Volume 29, Page 293, and which William W. Gibbs and Frances A. Gibbs, his wife, by Indenture bearing date the 9th day of January, 1900, and recorded at Easton, as aforesaid, in Deed Book G, Volume 29, Page 295, granted and conveyed unto Pen Argyl Water Company, its successors and assigns; and thereafter Pen Argyl Water Company and two other companies, namely, Wind Gap Water Company and Nazareth Water Company, were merged and consolidated into the Blue Mountain Consolidated Water Company by proceedings completed in the Department of State, at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, on the 17th day of December 1903, and the Certificate of the Secretary of the Commonwealth attesting thereto was entered in the Office for the Recording of Deeds, at Easton, as aforesaid, on the 9th day of November, 1909, and entered in Book of Miscellanies 48, at Page 533. Together with the right of ingress, egress and regress over the present unimproved private road extending from the hereinabove described tract westwardly to Pennsylvania Legislative Route No. 115, it being understood that Grantor, its successors and assigns, may at its expense, relocate said private road and thereby provide another means of ingress, egress and regress to Grantee, its successors and assigns.
