line North fifty-nine degrees west (N 59° W), four chains and fifty links (4 chains 50 links) to a stake and corner of said lot, thence North thirty-one degrees east (N 31° E) one chain eleven links (1 chain 11 links) to a stake in the line of Alex Gulick's thence along his line South fifty-nine degrees east (S 59° E) four chains and fifty links (4 chains 50 links) to a stake in the middle of aforesaid road, thence South thirty-one degrees west (S 31° W) one chain eleven links (1 chain 11 links) to the place of Beginning.
