

Oak Lawn Township, Greenville County, S. C., on the Augusta Road, about five (5) miles from the town of Belzer, containing one hundred and four (104) acres, more or less, and being composed of two (2) tracts of land as follows:

(a) One tract containing fourteen (14) acres of land, more or less and described as follows: Beginning at a stone and run thence S. $86\frac{1}{2}$ W. 10.36 chains on the public road leading from J. E. Cureton, Surveyor, November 19, 1889, and in 1918 bounded by lands of Hillary Shorter on the north; on the East by Dr. J. S. Brock; on the South by John S. Woodside; and on the west by John S. Woodside and Mrs. W. E. Cason.

2. all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Oak Lawn Township, containing thirty (30) acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a stake 34nm and running thence N. $89\frac{1}{4}$ E. 19.18 chains to a stake 34nm; thence N. 17 W. 18.08 chains to a stake 340m; thence S. 74 W. to a stake 340m; thence S. $75\frac{1}{2}$ W. to a stake 340m; thence to the beginning corner, and being bounded by lands of C. L. Woodside (1920) on the South; by J. E. Washington Estate on the East; by Griffin and West on the North; by Hillary Shorter on the West; being the same tract of land heretofore conveyed to C. L. Woodside by deed of Hillary Shorter, dated January 2, 1920, and
