MMM of Deeds, page 147 et seq.; and vol. VVV of Deeds, page 447 et seq; and to the said R. E. Johnston, conveyed April 4, 1904, by William Howard, under deed recorded in said R. M. C. office in vol. LLL of Deeds, page 697. Also all that piece, parcel or tract of land, adjoining the tract last above described, situate, lying and being on branch waters of North Saluda River in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, conveyed to Border State Lumber Company by R. E. Johnston, as containing 40 acres, more or less, under deed of Conveyance bearing date September 12, 1904, recorded in the office of the Registrar of Meane Conveyances for Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in vol.
