Sherman by deed dated October 26, 1925 recorded in Deed Book, Vol. 98 at page 240, R. M. L. Office for said County. Also - All that tract of land situate on road leading from Paris Mountain Road to the Finlay place about 100 yards from Paris Mountain Road adjoining lands of Hubbard, Bolling and Whitmire, containing 2 acres, more or less.
