WHEREAS, we, the said *J. J. Hunter, M. E. Hunter and Mrs. Geo. H. Anderson*, in and by a certain promissory note, in writing, of even date with these presents, are well and truly indebted to *South Carolina Savings Bank as Receiver for the Peoples Bank of Spartanburg, S.C.* in the full and just sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars, to be paid One Thousand Dollars on or before Jan 1, 1931, and Seven Hundred Dollars on or before Jan 1, 1932, and so on until paid in full.

with interest thereon, from date at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum to be computed and paid *as and forth* until paid in full all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of 10% *plus expenses*.

Abesides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on the said note, to be collectible as a part thereof; if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note, reference being thereunto had, as will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That we, the said *J. J. Hunter, M. E. Hunter and Mrs. Geo. H. Anderson*, in consideration of the sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said *South Carolina Savings Bank as Receiver*, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to us, the said *J. J. Hunter, M. E. Hunter and Mrs. Geo. H. Anderson*, in hand well and truly paid by the said *South Carolina Savings Bank as Receiver*,

at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said *South Carolina Savings Bank as Receiver*,

"all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land, being and lying in the State and County aforesaid, and containing 59.17 acres, more or less, and being part of the lands conveyed to J. D. Drummond by L. C. Garrett on Jan 2, 1917, by deed recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book 42, page 40, and being bounded by lands now or formerly owned by A. D. Woods, D. A. Coleman and others.

Also all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land adjoining the above described tract and containing twenty-three (23) acres, more or less, and being the same conveyed to J. D. Drummond by C. G. Garrett, by deed dated Jan 12, 1910.
