 or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note..... to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may
 sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage, said note further providing for an attorney's fee of 10.0%.

.....besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be
 added to the amount due on the said note....., to be collectible as a part thereof; if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part
 thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note....., reference being

 gain, sell and release unto the said C. P. Phillips

All that certain tract, or parcel of land situated in the County
 and State aforesaid, in Chickasawhing Township, and containing thirty-
 one (31) acres, more or less and bounded by lands of Clifton Bryant,
 A. B. Bridewell, J. A. Taylor and others, and being a part of the land
 of which Joseph Bryant died seized and possessed. For further
 description refer to deed of Grover Jones to Jessie and Mary Hilliard.
 The above is the same land willed and devised to us by
 the will of our father J. H. Bridewell, deceased, as will appear
