

Executors, Administrators, Successors or Assigns agree that any Judge of the Circuit Court of said State, at chambers or otherwise, and upon ex parte proceedings, or otherwise, may appoint a receiver, with authority to take possession of the said premises and collect the rents and profits thereof, applying the net proceeds so collected (after paying costs of collection) upon said debts, interest, insurance, or other legal assessment, costs or expenses; without liability to account for anything more than the rents and the profits actually collected, less said costs.

Provided Always, Nevertheless, and it is the true intent and meaning of the Parties to these Presents, that if the said mortgagor, shall well and truly pay, or cause to be paid, unto the said mortgagee, its certain attorney, successors or assigns, the said debt or sums of money aforesaid, with interest thereon, if any shall be due, according to the true intent and meaning of the said obligation and condition thereof, then this deed of bargain and sale shall cease, determine and be utterly null and void; otherwise it shall remain in full force and virtue.

And it is further agreed, by and between said parties, that the mortgagor shall hold and enjoy the said premises until default of payment shall be made.
