ing to or used in and about the said Hydro-Electric Power Plant; all the transmission lines formerly of the said Walhalla Light and Power Company, including all towers, poles, wires, insulators, transformers, meters, and all tools, apparatus, equipment, appliances, stores, stock, supplies and furnishings of whatsoever nature and wheresoever situated, constituting a part of or necessary adjunct to the said transmission lines, or used in and about the repair, maintenance, and operation of the same.

Also, all other properties, rights, powers, privileges, easements, and immunities owned, used, exercised, or enjoyed, or to which the Company is or may be justly entitled, as well in law as in equity, in connection with its business of generating, transmitting, and distributing electric current for public or private use, or constituting a necessary or useful part of its entire and complete Plant and equipment hereinbefore set out, whether the same are specifically and clearly herein set out and described or not.

That complete transmission system running from the hereinbefore mentioned hydro-electric power plant to the mill or factory of Chatham Manufacturing Company situate in or near the Town of Elkin, N. C., including all poles, towers, wires, insulators, transformers, tools, equipment, and supplies which are necessary or useful in the proper operation and maintenance of the aforesaid system for the transmission of electric power, together with the right-of-way for the said transmission line or lines over the lands owned by said Chatham Manufacturing Company, and all other rights, privileges, and easements necessary or appurtenant to the use and enjoyment of said right-of-way; and also all such rights of way for the said transmission line or lines, and the rights, privileges, and easements appurtenant thereto, as are now owned, exercised or enjoyed by the Company over the lands belonging to or claimed by other parties.
