SEND GREETING:

Whereas, the said Zaidee Poe Bogwell,  
 in and by my certain promissory note in writing, of even date with these presents,  
 well and truly indebted to The First National Bank of Greenville, S.C., and Harriet Poe  
 in the full and just sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)  
 to be paid on or before the 1st day of April 1946.

with interest thereon from the date of this instrument and at the rate of six per centum per annum, to be computed and paid semi-annually  
 until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear  
 interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, the whole amount evidenced by said note to  
 become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and in case said note after its maturity, should  
 be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if before its maturity it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection  
 of his interests to place and the holder should place the said note or this mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings, then and in either  
 of said cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses, including 10 per cent. of the indebtedness as attorney fees, this to be added to the mort-  
 gage indebtedness, and to be secured under the mortgage as a part of said debt.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, that the said Zaidee Poe Bogwell,  
 in consideration of the said debt and sum of money

aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said The First National Bank of Greenville, S.C.  
 and Harriet Poe Bogwell, as Trustees for Eugenia Maxwell Poe,  
 according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration to the further sum of Three Dollars, to

the said Zaidee Poe Bogwell, and Harriet Poe Bogwell, as Trustees for Eugenia Maxwell Poe,  
 in hand well and truly paid by the said The First National Bank of Greenville, S.C. and Harriet Poe Bogwell, as Trustees for Eugenia Maxwell Poe, their successors and assigns;

All my right, title and interest, the same being a one-half undivided  
 interest in and to that lot of land situate on the North side of East  
 North Street, in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South  
 Carolina, containing 2.1 acres more or less, and being known as the home  
 place of the late F. W. Poe, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a stake on North Street, common corner of Beattie and  
 Box, thence along North Street, N. 82-15-0. 186.25 feet to a stake, common corner  
 of Box and Marshall, thence N. 43-30-21. 345.75 feet to a stone, thence N. 1-71-21.  
 269.50 feet to a stake, common corner of Box and Hanner, thence along said  
 Street, N. 51-45-21.30 feet to a stake, common corner of Box and Beattie,  
 thence between Beattie and Box, S. 41-15-21. 191.00 feet to a stake, thence still  
 with Beattie line S. 2-45-0. 5-12.50 feet to a stake, thence still with Beattie  
 line S. 2 E. 88.25 feet to the beginning containing 2.1 acres, being the  
 home place of the late F. W. Poe, which was conveyed to him by  
 Hannah J. Day, by deed dated February 29, 1888, and recorded in  
 Volume "U U", page 138.

One-fourth interest in said property having been devised to me by  
 will of the late F. W. Poe, which is on file in the office of the Judge of  
 Probate for Greenville County in Apartment No 209, file 7, and the  
 one-fourth interest of Francis W. Poe having been conveyed to me by deed  
 dated April 16th, 1927, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville  
 County in Deeds Volume 29 at page 103.

In further security to my note to the mortgagors, I hereby assign  
 and set over to the First National Bank of Greenville and Harriet Poe  
 Bogwell, as Trustees for Eugenia Maxwell Poe, all my interest in the  
 rents accruing from the premises above described now due or hereafter  
 to become due with authority to them to collect said rents and apply to  
 the payment of insurance and taxes on said premises, and to the interest  
 and principal on said note all sums which may come into their hands  
 from my portion of said rents.
