all that tract or lot of land in *Greenville* Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.
 about $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Greenville Court House, and near the Augusta Road, and bounded by land of W. P. Childers, Estate of J. E. Earle, J. R. Jenkins, J. E. Ross and H. Schwiers and having the following metes and bounds, and courses and distances to wit: Beginning at a stone at the corner of lands of H. Schwiers and J. R. Jenkins, and running thence along Jenkins' line S. 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 30-10 to iron pin, thence along line of Estate of J. E. Earle, N. 75 $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 9.55 to a stake (hickory gone) thence S. 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 1.97 to Red Oak stump, thence N. 40 W. 5.00 to three white oaks, thence N. 47 $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 8.32 to red oak, thence N. 25 $\frac{3}{4}$ W. 20 links to iron pin, thence along line of W. P. Childers N. 55 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 39.60 to iron pin at Childers and Ross' corner, thence along line of lands of J. E. Ross and H.
