## AMORTIZATION MORTGAGE

E.W. KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That

I.L. Smith (also known as James L. Smith) of Greenville County and State aforesaid, hereinafter called first party, whether one or more, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, First party is indebted to the Land Bank Commissioner, acting pursuant to Part 3 of the Act of Congress approved May 12, 1933, known as the Emergency Farm Mortgage Act of 1933, hereinafter called second party, as evidenced by a certain promissory note, of even date herewith, for the principal sum of Seventeen Thousand dollars (\$17,000.00) Dollars, payable to the order of the second party, together with interest from the date of said note on the principal sum remaining from time to time unpaid, at the rate of Five  $\frac{1}{2}$  per centum per annum, the first payment of interest being due and payable on the First day of September, 1933, and thereafter interest being due and payable annually; said principal sum being due and payable in 17 equal, successive annual installments of One Hundred Seventy dollars (\$170.00) each Dollars each, and a final installment of One Dollars (\$1.00) Dollars, the first installment of said principal being due and payable on the First day of September, 1937, and thereafter the remaining installments of principal being due and payable annually until the entire principal sum and interest are paid in full; all of which and such other terms, conditions, and agreements as are contained in the said note, will more fully appear by reference thereto.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That first party, in consideration of the debt as evidenced by the said note, and for better securing the payment thereof to second party, according to the terms of the said note, and the performance of the conditions and covenants herein contained, and also in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to first party in hand well and truly paid by second party, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, and released, in fee simple, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release in fee simple, unto second party, his successors and assigns, the following described lands, to wit:

All that certain piece, parcel and tract of land, being and lying situate on the Pelham Road about one mile in a northerly direction of the Town of Simpsonville in Austin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing thirty and thirteen hundredths (30.13), acres according to a plat made by W. J. Piddle on June 29th, 1933, said lands being bounded on the north by Letitia Boldin on the East by the said Letitia Boldin and S. Jenkins, on South by J. B. Wood, and on the West by the J. A.
