with interest thereon, from date April 1st, 1934, at the rate of 7 per cent. per annum to be computed and paid.

until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at the same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of.

Ten Per Cent. besides all costs and expenses of collection, to be added to the amount due on the said note, to be collectible as a part thereof, if the same be placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, or if said debt, or any part thereof, be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); as in and by the said note reference being thereunto had, will more fully appear.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That I, the said Lillie Black, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Ernest L. Chiles,

according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to the said Ernest L. Chiles, in hand well and truly paid by the said

Ernest L. Chiles, at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Ernest L. Chiles, and his heirs and assigns,

All that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Austin Township, County and State aforesaid and being more fully described as follows: Beginning on a small poplar and running thence N. 77 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 10.00 to a stone, thence S. 41 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 35.00 to a stone, thence S. 57 $\frac{1}{4}$  W. 13.25 to a stone, thence S. 15 E. 10.84 to a stone, thence N. 28 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 9.75 to a stone in road, thence N. 34 $\frac{3}{4}$  W. 3.50 to an angle in said road, thence N. 51 $\frac{1}{4}$  W. 4.40 to angle in said road; thence N. 50 $\frac{3}{4}$  W. 7.00 to angle, thence N. 43 $\frac{1}{4}$  W. 1.65 to an angle; thence N. 31 $\frac{3}{4}$  W. 9.20 to an angle, thence N. 34 W. 1.27 to stone in road, thence N. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 13.50 to the beginning corner, and containing 58 acres, more or less.

Also, all that other piece, parcel or tract of land joining the above described tract, and described as follows: Beginning at a stone on corner of land now or formerly owned by Sloan and Mrs. theirsele S. 15 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 23.24 to a stone, thence S. 53 $\frac{3}{4}$  W. 13.00 to a stone, thence N. 15 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 24.02 to a stone, thence N. 57 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 12.47 to the beginning corner and containing 28.33 acres, more or less.
