in the full and just sum of One Thousand and no 100 Dollars to be paid: one year after date

with interest thereon from the date of this note at the rate of seven per cent, per annum, to be computed and paid until paid in full; all interest not paid when due to bear interest at same rate as principal; and if any portion of principal or interest be at any time past due and unpaid, then the whole amount evidenced by said note to become immediately due, at the option of the holder hereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; said note further providing for an attorney's fee of three per cent, besides all costs and expenses of collection, debt, or any part thereof, to be collected by an attorney or by legal proceedings of any kind (all of which is secured under this mortgage); and in and by the said note, reference being thereto had, will more fully appear.

NOW KNOW ALL MEN, That the said Mortgagor, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said Mortgagee, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, the said Mortgagor, in hand well and truly paid by the said Mortgagee, at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain and release unto the said Mortgagee, all

Heirs and Assigns, forever, all and singular that certain piece, parcel, lot or tract of land situate, lying and being in Austin Township, Greenville County, State aforesaid,

containing 101 1/2 acres, more or less, according to deed of J. E. Forrester to R. A. Whatley, dated January, 26, 1901, recorded in Deed Book XX, page 447, R. M. L. Office for Said Greenville County. Said land lies on the branch waters of Siddle's Creek, waters of Enoree River, about seven miles from Greenville Court House, bounded by lands now or formerly of Sallie Bramlett, R. A. Smith, J. E. Forrester Estate, and the B. & N. L. Railroad, and is described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at a stake in a public road, and thence running N. 12-20 E. 9.50 chains to a stake in line of Jesse Locke and Jones McKinney land, thence still along said Locke and Mc Kinney land, N. 13 E. 19.38 chains to a stone on line of land of Mrs. Sallie Forrester Bramlett, thence along the line of said Bramlett land S. 71 E. 41.26 crossing a branch to a stone, corner of Bramlett land, thence along the line of A. R. Smith Estate land S. 13 1/4 E. 13.50 to a stone, thence N. 79 1/4 E. 12.02 to a stone, thence S. 35-40 E. 18.26 to a stake on line of Leopard property, thence still along line of Leopard property N. 60-48 E. 22.73 to a stake in said road, beginning corner.
