NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagetr, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgager may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Bollars (\$5.06) to the Mortgager in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the scaling and distivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, hargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgages, its successors and assigns:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, Greenville, Township, on the southern side of Goodrich Street, being shown as Lots Nos. 23 and 24, on plat of property of Motlie Fortner, made by R. E. Dalton, Eng., in July, 1922, recorded in Plat Book F, at Page 73, and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake on the Southern side of Goodrich Street, corner of Lot #25, and running thence with the line of said lot S. 34-34 W. 169.7 feet to a stake in line of lot No. 21; thence with the line of lot No. 21 S. 50-34 E. 100 feet to a stake, corner of Lot No. 22; thence with the line of said lot N. 34-34 E. 193 feet, more or less, to a stake on Goodrich Street; thence with the southern side of Goodrich Street approximately 110 feet to the beginning corner; subject, however to the right-of-way of the Piedmont & Northern Railway Co., as shown on said plat; being the same property conveyed to J. C. Shockley by Lewis W. Hazelwood, by deed dated June 17th, 1943, recorded in Volume 255 at Page 134.
